

Transport

Travelling by car: Head south on the M23, and continue onto the A23, take the B2115 towards Warninglid and Cuckfield Village. Continue onto Staplefield Lane and turn left onto Sloughgreen Lane, then turn right onto Cuckfield Road, B2115. Continue to follow B2114 and at the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Whiteman's Green, B2036. Turn left onto London Lane and left onto Broad Street. B2184. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto A272, then stay on the A272 until you reach Batts Bridge Roundabout and take the 3rd exit onto A22 towards Uckfield. At the next roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Uckfield Bypass, A22, then take the 2nd exit at the next roundabout and the 3rd exit at the next roundabout. Your destination will be on the left.

Travelling by train: The nearest mainline station is Uckfield, approx. 2 miles away.

Borde Hill

A guided tour of Borde Hill Garden followed by a light lunch. The "garden rooms" at Borde Hill were originally planted by Col Robert Stephenson Clark but have been renewed, updated and refreshed by subsequent generations of the family, giving the visitor a series of delights including Jay Robin's Rose Garden, Italian Garden, Paradise Walk, Round Dell, Garden of Allah and Azalea Ring. Family home of gardener, gardening writer and TV presenter, Christopher Lloyd, the house was designed by Edwin Lutyens, whose work in Delhi and Flanders made him one of the most famous architects of the 20th century. The garden was nurtured by Lloyd until his death in 2006 and is in the Arts & Crafts style with three 18th century oast houses and a 15th century barn in its midst

Hever Castle

Historic Hever Castle and Gardens was the childhood home to Anne Boleyn, mother of Queen Elizabeth I. The double-moated 14th century castle is set in 125 acres of grounds and time is allowed to visit the castle and the magnificent award-winning gardens.



David started gardening as a young child and has been growing plants for more than 40 years. He has worked in gardens and nurseries, growing on a range of different soils and in different types of microclimate. His extensive knowledge and practical experience of plants, crops and growing techniques is founded on a thorough botanical and scientific training, complemented by an in depth understanding of garden design, wildlife, geology and climatology. He also trained as a teacher and has taught a huge diversity of subjects from botany, soil science and plant identification, to propagation, garden design and crop production, and from City & Guilds through to Degree level. He is also a popular speaker with local gardening groups.

As a journalist, David has spent more than 20 years writing for and editing the nation's crop of garden magazines, currently as Associate Editor for BBC Gardeners' World Magazine. He has also written for a number of websites and appeared both as a regular contributor and an expert commentator on TV and radio. David is a popular figure in the horticultural world, well liked and respected for his knowledge by nurserymen, professional gardeners, journalists and the gardening public. He has designed, built and planted show gardens and display stands at most of the major garden shows in the UK, including the world-famous Chelsea Flower Show, and is now a Designate Judge for the Royal Horticultural Society.

He has also travelled to every continent, with the exception of Antarctica, to discover plants and gardens, both independently and on more than 50 trips accompanying groups of gardeners

David will give one introductory talk during the tour.
