

If you are travelling by car:

From the A470:

From the A4871, turn onto The Pont Fawr (Inigo Jones Bridge) Llanrwst, and follow the B5106 north for approx. 5 miles and your destination will be on the right.

If you are travelling by train:

The closest railway station is Dolgarrog, which is a 13 minute drive to the hotel.

OPlaces Visited

Maenan Hall

A superbly beautiful 4 hectares on the slopes of the Conwy Valley, with dramatic views of Snowdonia, set amongst mature hardwoods. Both the upper part, with sweeping lawns, ornamental ponds and retaining walls, and the bluebell carpeted woodland dell contain copious specimen shrubs and trees, many originating at Bodnant. Magnolias, rhododendrons, camellias, pieris, cherries and hydrangeas, amongst many others, make a breathtaking display.

Bodnant Gardens

With intimate corners, sweeping lawns, grand terraces and verdant woodland, there are many gardens in one at Bodnant. Created over 150 years, with plants collected and brought to Britain from far afield, and the incredible vision of generations of the McLaren family and Puddle head gardeners, this haven of rarity and beauty with a stunning backdrop of the Carneddau mountains of Snowdonia is a delight for the senses. https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/bodnant-garden

Plas Brondanw

Plas Brondanw was given to Sir Clough Williams-Ellis by his father in 1902. The gardens at Plas Brondanw are the finest example of Sir Clough's talent for creative landscape design. The main features date from the early part of the 20th Century before he began Portmeirion, but work continued on and off until the 1960's. Sir Clough created a unique and characteristic garden landscape which provides a series of dramatic and romantic prospects set within the Snowdonia National Park, between Snowdon and the sea. Inspired by the gardens of renaissance Italy, strong architectural influences are evident within the Plas gardens, stone walls, topiary and avenues of trees leading the eye to the dramatic back drop of the mountains beyond. https://www.plasbrondanw.com/

Glaslyn Osprey Centre

When the RSPB's stewardship of the Glaslyn ospreys came to an end in 2013 a group of interested wildlife enthusiasts agreed to take over the reins and run the project at a local level. Consequently in 2013 Bywyd Gwyllt Glaslyn Wildlife (BGGW) was set up as a community interest company with the aim of continuing the work of protecting breeding ospreys in the Glaslyn Valley, whilst at the same time highlighting the wealth of other wildlife in the region.

Portmeirion

In 1925, Welsh architect Clough Williams-Ellis acquired the site which was to become Portmeirion. He had been searching for a suitable site for his proposed ideal village for several years and when he heard that the Aber lâ estate near Penrhyndeudraeth was for sale, he did not hesitate to make an offer. He wanted to show how a naturally beautiful location could be developed without spoiling it, and that one could actually enhance the natural background through sympathetic development. The Aber lâ estate had everything he had hoped for as a site for his architectural experiment: steep cliffs overlooking a wide sandy estuary, woods, streams and a nucleus of old buildings.

Plas Newydd

Plas Newydd is an enchanting mansion and gardens, with spectacular views of Snowdonia and the Menai Strait. Home of the Marquess of Anglesey, its previous historic residents include the 1st Marquess, who lost his leg during the Battle of Waterloo, and the flamboyant 5th Marquess. This elegant 18th century house is an interesting mixture of classical and Gothic which also boasts Rex Whistler's 58-foot mural. The Grade I-listed landscape consists of 40 acres of garden and 129 acres of woodland and parkland, and include the Terraces, Rhododendron Garden and Australasian Arboretum. https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/visit/wales/plas-newydd-house-and-garden

Plas Cadnant

In 1996, the present owner bought the 200-acre Plas Cadnant Estate and work began on the restoration of the historic garden and grounds. Since then large parts of the gardens have undergone a spectacular transformation and have been restored to their former glory. Described as one of North Wales best kept secrets is the hidden world of Plas Cadnant Gardens, situated at the side of the Menai Strait, hidden from view near to Menai Bridge on the Isle of Anglesey. Three different gardens have been discovered, including an unusual walled garden with curving walls and pool, a secret valley garden with three waterfalls and river, and an upper woodland garden with stone outcrops and the remains of a 19th century folly. http://www.plascadnant.co.uk/2/en-GB/THE-HIDDEN-GARDENS

Tony Russell has worked in horticulture for almost 40 years, including 14 years in charge of Britain's National Arboretum at Westonbirt and 10 years as plant consultant to the National Trust. He is the author of 20 published books on gardens, plants and trees and the editor of the annual publication Great Gardens to Visit. There is a considerable amount of walking around the different attractions, and some of the gardens are extensive. Paths will be a mixture of paved, tarmac, and gravel. Some sections of path may be muddy if there has been recent rainfall. Some gardens will have fairly steep paths and slopes. Please also note that some steps may have handrails, but historic stone steps may not.
