Transport

If you are travelling by car:

From the M5: Exit the M5 at J8, then join M50. Exit at J 1, signposted Malvern. At roundabout take a left and you will see the Hilton Puckrup Hall on your right. Drive down the driveway and you will see the entrance to the hotel and golf reception.

If you are travelling by train: The nearest train station is Ashchurch for Tewkesbury – 8 miles away

(i) Places Visited

Ludlow Castle

Ludlow Castle was a significant royal residence during the Tudor period, home of Prince Edward (later Edward V), Prince Arthur (eldest son of Henry VII), and Catherine of Aragon. We gain a glimpse into the lifestyle of medieval and Tudor society as we walk through the Castle grounds and take in the superb views over the Shropshire countryside.

Worcester Cathedral

Worcester Cathedral is known for being the burial site of Prince Arthur Tudor, the eldest son of Henry VII, his chantry located to the right of the High Altar and features heraldic carvings representing the Houses of York, Lancaster, Beaufort, and even the pomegranate, symbolizing Catherine of Aragon. This rich display of Tudor symbolism highlights the political alliances of the time. The cathedral is a stunning example of Gothic architecture and continues to attract visitors for both its beauty and historical significance. https://www.worcestercathedral.org.uk/

Raglan Castle

Raglan Castle is renowned for its impressive design, featuring a dramatic gatehouse, a grand tower, and a series of ornamental gardens. Raglan Castle was a symbol of power and prestige during the Tudor era. Originally built in the 15th century by Sir William ap Thomas and later transformed into a luxurious residence by his son, Raglan Castle hosted important figures and events before being partially destroyed during the English Civil War.


Tewkesbury Abbey

Tewkesbury Abbey is an active place of worship and a popular destination for visitors interested in its rich history and architectural beauty. It is a stunning example of Norman architecture and one of the best-preserved medieval abbeys in England. Built in the 12th century, the abbey is renowned for its impressive Romanesque design, featuring a grand nave, beautiful stained-glass windows, and a remarkable vaulted ceiling. The abbey is historically significant, as it was the site of the 1471 Battle of Tewkesbury, a pivotal conflict during the Wars of the Roses.
