Transport

The Radisson Blu Leeds City Centre Hotel is excellently situated in The Light complex in the centre of Leeds.

Travelling by car: The hotel can be easily reached via the M1 and M621.

From the M1, exit towards Civic Precinct Hospital from A58(M). Continue on A58. Take Westgate and Great George Street to Dudley Way and the car park is on Dudley Way on the right-hand side. To get to the hotel, head south on Dudley Way towards St Annes Street and the hotel is on the left-hand side.

Travelling by train: The closest railway station is Leeds which is 0.6 miles away - approximately a 5-minute walk or a short taxi ride from the hotel.



Radisson Blu Leeds City Centre

Located in the city centre in a meticulously restored building that once served as the main office of the Leeds Permanent Building Society, the hotel has kept the original art deco style setting and provides a restaurant, bar and a discounted pass to use for the nearby gym. Bedrooms at the hotel are stylish with ensuite bathroom, TV, telephone, wifi, safe, hairdryer and tea/coffee making facilities.

Car parking is available at 'Q-Park The Light', a secure underground car park. The postcode for your GPS is LS2 8BD. You'll receive a discount when parking here and staying at the hotel. On entry to the car park, you will receive an entry ticket, present this ticket to the reception staff at the hotel when checking out to get the electronic discount.

Parking is reduced for guests per 24 hours, please ensure you get your ticket validated by the hotel front desk team. Please check the hotel website for the most up to date information on prices for car parking.

Check-in and departure from the hotel

Dining

(i) Places Visited

Salts Mill

In 1853, Salts Mill was opened by Sir Titus Salt as a huge textile factory. During the peak of its production, the mill manufactured 30,000 yards of cloth every single day and was an integral aspect of both the British and global textile industry. Now the space has been transformed into a hub for art and leisure and contains one of the largest collections of work by the Bradford born artist, David Hockney. This permanent collection displays paintings, prints and photographs dating from 1960's to the present day. Salts Mill is located in the village of Saltaire which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and a centre of architectural and historical importance.

Leeds Art Gallery

Home to a rich variety of art on display from Leeds' impressive collections, Leeds Art Gallery has nationally acclaimed prints, watercolours, paintings, sculptures, photography, and contemporary art. Wandering between rooms you will see well-known artists from Yorkshire, such as Henry Moore, Barbara Hepworth, Atkinson Grimshaw, Jacob Kramer, as well as work by a range of contemporary artists including Paula Rego, Bridget Riley, Georgina Starr, Tony Cragg, Antony Gormley and Francis Bacon. https://museumsandgalleries.leeds.gov.uk/leeds-art-gallery/

Hepworth Wakefield

The Hepworth Wakefield gallery opened in 2011 and has been described by the Independent as "one of the finest contemporary art museums in Europe". The gallery places emphasis on work from Wakefield's own art collection by artists such as Henry Moore, Ben Nicholson, Graham Sunderland, Paul Nash and LS Lowry. This is combined with exhibitions by modern artists, and rarely seen works by Barbara Hepworth. Designed by British architect David Chipperfield, the gallery is a striking example of innovative contemporary architecture and can be regarded as a work of art in itself.

Madeline is an active researcher in addition to lecturing and teaching across the UK, as well as co-managing the Travel Editions' 20th Century Art in Yorkshire tours for the past 6 years.



Madeline will give two lectures during the tour:

'20th Century Art in Yorkshire' - An introduction to the life and works of David Hockney, and a summary of the tour to follow.

'Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore' - A lecture about the lives and influence of artists Barbara Hepworth and Henry Moore.

Tour manager - Your tour manager will be on hand throughout the tour to ensure that everything operates according to plan.
